





- An excellent teacher, though I felt somewhat overwhelmed at times by the huge volume of anecdotal and extracurricular information provided in lectures.
- Dr. Fessler is a great lecturer who engages in student's interests but sometimes he explains too fast or uses complex clusters when I wish that he could instead use simple and straightforward examples. I attended every 8am lecture but one, and I tried my best to focus in class but it was difficult to grasp some concepts. If he had put it in simpler terms, I'm sure it would be easier to understand. The material he taught piqued my interest and I feel that I have learned something very useful from the class. I loved that he gave us the exam questions beforehand to avoid test anxiety, but this only increases the grading standards so there is a cost. Thanks Prof. Fessler!
- Dr. Fessler is very entertaining and engaging. He is passionate about what he is teaching and deeply cares about how it affects his students. He is definitely one of my favorite professors at UCLA. Course material was relevant not only to the field, but also in everyday life. - It was helpful that the class did not contain PowerPoint, lecture methods without PowerPoint are a more effective method of learning for the students.
 It would be more helpful if the Professor presented the material in lecture more thoroughly as many of the concepts may be difficult to grasp, explaining and giving examples would help to improve students' understanding of the material. Furthermore, it would be helpful to relate the topics we learn in class with topics that are occurring with current events.

The structure of the class worked very well for me and I don't agree with people who say there is too much reading. The reading is very interesting and as the quarter goes on, it gets easier to speed read and understand the scientific research papers. There is only one thing I can think of that I would change about the class. When the quizzes are administered, I get flustered when the question and answers are read out loud. It would be easier if the question was just put up on the overhead and then we got 30 seconds of silence to think. I am seriously considering picking up an anthropology minor because of this class. It was absolutely amazing.
- Professor Fessler is by far the greatest professor I've had at UCLA. The class was engaging and I felt like I was interacting with him rather than just trying to memorize information. I found the course to be very informative and I would not change anything about it.

I think in the future if he can post the notes that he projects on the class website so that we wouldn't have to worry about writing it down, it would be helpful. This way we can be more engaged and can listen more intently during his lecture. Another note is the tangents, if there are tangents please make them relevant

animated you are. It makes going to an 8am class more and easier to stay awake. The only troubling part about lecture is when you put up slides and take them down really fast. It is hard to read the slides quickly, even if you wear glasses like I do, because it is a large lecture hall. I also write my notes, because I find it is a better way to learn the material rather than typing them up; therefore, it takes longer for me to paraphrase slides while at the same time trying to listen to what you are saying. Even though you say you don't have to copy down the slides, I still like to read them to get an outline of what you are referring to when lecturing. I truly enjoyed the class and learned so much. It is one of the most interesting classes I have taken at UCLA!
