





The seminar worked more as a lecture but the material was rather interesting.

Open Questions:

What did you learn in this seminar that you consider valuable?

- -how to see through the lens of an autistic individual
 -aspects of animal behavior and how the environment affects them
- Animal behavior and human behavior principles.
- Essentially the focus of the class was comparing the way animals think to the way humans think through an autistic lense. It really helped me understand the amazing capabilities animals have and learned to respect them in a whole new way. By understanding how they think, I can understand how they behave and learn how to handle animals and respect them as other fellow creatures.
- How to think analytically about evolution and its connection to everyday behavior
- I learned a lot about basic human and animal characteristics which I consider very valuable.
- I learnt a lot about culture, communication, austism, and social learning in this seminar class. The manner in which the Professor presented his ideas was more straightforward than I had yet experienced at UCLA, with an emphasis on the student's understanding which I found extremely refreshing. I found the subjects breached in this class corresponded very well with what I was learning in my Anthro 128 A class and would really recommend other students take the two classes concurrently. I LOVED this professor, too bad he's not teaching this Spring.
- I loved this seminar and really appreciated how it was an umbrella of a seminar, encompassing many different topics. As a south campus student primarily concerned with chem, physics, calc, etc, it was a great break in my day to hear professor Fessler lecture about topics such as evolutionary psychology, autism, and animal behavior. The seminar encouraged me to think more analytically about why some things are the way they are. I left each section with something new to consider.
- New ideas, concepts and theories regarding evolutionary psychology and themes of autism and its relation to animal thinking. It was my most favorable class of the quarter and I actually learned useful things and ideas to apply to life.

- I did not engage with other students nor did I learn from them seeing as this class was almost entirely lecture.
- I didn't discuss much with other students in the class. Primarily the course was structured around the

ideas relating to the book and elaboration of the instructor, which I found fascinating on its own.

- I didn't have much engagement with other students because the seminar was primarily lecture based, but I have no complaints on that matter. I enjoyed that it was primarily lecture based.
- I learned more about other students and what they are involved in and was able to relate to them
- Not much exchange, the course was still interesting.
- The experiences of the other students, especially those who had worked with children with disabilities like autism and downs syndrome, really helped give interesting perspective to topics touched on in the book we were reading.
- There was not much engagement with other students. However, I took what students voiced in class and learned from their experiences with animals or autistic children.
- There was not much interaction between students in this class, in the short time frame we had there wouldn't really have been enough time for students to break into groups and still get much lecture time.

- Besides listening to the instructor, there wasn't much interaction.
- Did not interact personally with the instructor, didn't really affect my seminar experience.
- He would have demonstrations but mostly he lectured with little participation asked from the class which i felt was slightly disappointing.
- I felt comfortable to ask my instructor questions after class, however didn't feel the need to get outside of class help.
- I loved the amount of interaction with the instructor and it's small class size so we felt free to ask him any questions, as opposed to the large lecture hall environment.
