





- Dr. Fessler has great advice on life and how the material relates to real issues. For example, I enjoyed his talk on the Concorde Fallacy as it relates to choosing a career. His views are very rooted in the discipline of anthropological evolution and his explanation of predictions are stimulating. He can improve on being more interactive in his discussions by involving the class more. The course was satisfactory in terms of organization but could work on being more clear in its research goals and current studies.

I enjoyed coming to seminar every week, as Dr. Fessler would always have some wisdom to impart on us.
