

- 5.1) What did you learn in this seminar that you consider valuable?
- I knew many reasons why animals behave the way they do.
- I learned a lot about animal behavior and its connection to the way autistic people think by reading the required text. During the seminar, we mostly talked about animals and perspectives. I believe these concepts were valuable because having sympathy for autistic people, animals, and other humans allows us to better interact with them and treat them in civil, fair manners.
- I learned fascinating concepts about psychology and the way human and animals perceive the world.
- I learned much more about, not only how animals and people with autism think and experience the world, but also how I view the world and why humans do some of the things that we do. Very interesting!
- I learned the correlation between autistic people and animals and how animals think and function.
- I really enjoyed the book and the tack the professor took in discussing it
- It put into perspective of human and animal thinking in the real world as well has in relation to each other over time. It also made me think analytically about how to connect ideas for seemingly very different topics such as autism and animal thinking.
